ST MARY THE VIRGIN CHURCHYARD AND PRAYER GARDEN

We are so fortunate in Padbury to have a beautiful churchyard, which is lovingly cared for chiefly by **Neil Gibbard** and a few other folk who I know help but don't make themselves known. Thank you and bless you all. Many people walk the public footpaths that are accessed from the churchyard and it is lovely to see them so well used. The church is always open if you want a quiet sit down.



Have you visited the Quiet Prayer Garden presided over by a seat in memory of Bill Thatcher, a real stalwart of Padbury throughout his life? The expansive views give a feeling of peace and tranquillity in all weathers.

In order to keep the churchyard as we would all wish, I would like to draw your attention to the fact that there are strict national rules and regulations regarding the care of all graves, ledger stones and memorials. These rules are there not just to ensure that the area can be enjoyed by everybody but also to protect the flora and fauna so important to the green environment.

The following will be removed:

- Plastic flowers, which are not permitted at any time.
- Withered or dead cut flowers and wreaths.
- Silk and good quality artificial flowers ARE permitted, but once the type of flower is out of season it will be removed.
- Faded or decaying artificial flowers or those out of season.
- Teddy bears, photographs, balloons or other sentimental items if they are left for more than 6 weeks following interment.

Kerbs, railings, posts or chains to enclose a grave are NOT permitted

Artificial poppy wreaths are allowed at the time of Remembrance but should be removed by the end of November.

Christmas Wreaths are also allowed and should be removed by the end of January.

I do hope that it is appreciated that these rules are for the benefit of us all. I hate removing items from graves or memorial ledgers – it is upsetting but has to be done if things are not to get out of control.












REPORT ON PADBURY VILLAGE HALL

This report on Padbury Village Hall was presented to Padbury Parish Council, 20th May 2024.

Padbury Village Hall is the heart of the village. It is home to fourteen activity groups and hosts a variety of events for the entertainment of the community. It is maintained solely by income derived from the hire of the hall, fundraising events organised by the committee, and donations.

In the past the hall has staged some highly successful pantos and has hosted several drama productions. It has been the venue for various children's playgroups and both adult and children's birthday parties. In other words it's a venue for the activities of both young and old. It has an excellent, well-appointed kitchen comprising two fridges, a dishwasher, two cookers and an extremely popular bar! The disabled facilities in the women's toilets have been improved and now the men have separate toilets of their own!

Now to the clubs that hire the hall. Of all the groups who have used the hall regularly, the WI is the longest standing, having clocked up more than 60 years. The Camera Club has a tally of over 30 years. The groups that use the hall most often are the Pilates groups.

Older villagers appreciate the companionship of the Friendly Afternoon which meets monthly. The hall is also home to the Compassionate Friends and Bucks Vision, the visually impaired group.

On a Tuesday morning the enthusiastic members of the Art Club convene to paint and draw together. Sylvia Patchett who leads the group says, " The hall is light and airy and always warm (a bonus in the cold winter months)". She praises the kitchen facilities and concludes, " We are lucky to have such an excellent facility on our doorstep".

The hall is also the meeting place for the Table Tennis and U₃A music groups. But by far the best fundraiser is the well-attended and very profitable Friday night Bingo session run by Carol Bloxham.

On an annual basis villagers have the opportunity to go to the hall for a Saturday dance organised by the over 100 year old Sick Benefit Society whose members and guests have a feast on the Monday and, in September every year, everyone can admire the produce of fellow villagers at the popular Produce Show.

The monthly Coffee Mornings have attracted a variety of villagers, ranging from babes-in-arms and toddlers to mothers, grandparents and even great grandparents! The money raised from these meetings is shared with the Church.

Aside from the groups who enjoy their meetings in the hall, the Village Hall Committee work hard to organise fundraising events for the benefit of the community. In the past there have been an Italian Evening with Italian food and an opera singer, a French Evening and an Indian Evening with Indian food and a display of Indian dancing.

More recently a Quiz Night with Fish and Chips tested the brains of both young and old and the very successful Cheese and Wine Evening with singer, Paul French, even had people on the dance floor!

In the future and with the cooperation of Thornborough and Thornton Village Hall committee we have booked Miles Nottage to play in Botolph Claydon Village Hall on May 11th for everyone \$\%#39\$; entertainment and to raise money for both halls. Also in the future the Opera Dudes are due to appear on September 28th and, later in the year, on December 7th, there will be a Christmas Celebration of Local Crafts and Produce which will run all day.
