STICKS AND STONES

Please take the opportunity to check your property boundary this Autumn as hedges and vegetation will have grown over the past two seasons. Do you have an overgrown hedge or vegetation that restricts the use of the road or pavement?

Hedges and vegetation should not obstruct the highway or pavements. The responsibility for maintaining these lies with the property owner.

Also, if you have a drive that is made of stones, gravel or similar please sweep back any that has migrated to the public footpath or road. As well as retaining your drive you are removing a hazard. As well as causing possible damage to the footpath, a stone could be flicked up and hit a passing pedestrian or vehicle. You could be liable for any damage or harm caused.

As well as increasing Police presence this could lead to further traffic calming measures being implemented. Full training is offered for all new volunteers.

You would be gathering data with two other volunteers at the roadside as vehicles pass. The Parish Clerk can provide further details if you would like to join.

FROM BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNCIL:

Could you get pension credit?

Following the government's decision this week to withdraw the winter fuel payment from most pensioners, Buckinghamshire Council is advising residents of pensionable age and their friends and families that it's vital they find out which government benefits they can claim to help them meet their living and fuel costs.

The winter fuel payment is now limited to people over state pension age (currently 66) who are receiving pension credit or a limited number of other benefits.

Older people over state pension age and on a low income may qualify for pension credit – which offers support for a range of household expenses including the winter fuel payment, but many are not aware and are not claiming this support that they are eligible for.

According to the government, only about 60% of eligible people currently claim pension credit countrywide. This means four out of 10 eligible pensioners are missing out on benefits of up to £3,900 a year.

The council is also highlighting that support is still available through its Helping Hand service for people who may not qualify for pension credit but who are still struggling financially. The team can offer emergency support, practical guidance or supply contact details for other organisations that provide food support or specialist advice.

PVFC's 2024/25 season has commenced with the 1st team being promoted to the Spartan South Midlands Div. 2. 



Allotment Update

Mrs Kelly, one of our Teaching Assistants, has taken on the challenge this year of transforming our allotment. This is what she has done so far...

'During the start of the Summer holidays the ground was covered and left for three weeks, this allowed the grass to die off enough to lift. The grass was cleared by me and a couple of ladies who have allotment plots who kindly gave up their time. I was then able to cover the ground with a weed membrane. Miss White and I then placed pallet collars on the plot creating raised beds, this gives a raised bed for each class, plus an extra two beds to grow flowers and strawberries. We also planted a hedge of Raspberries.'

I am very excited that the whole school will now be able to access the allotment and get into growing crops for harvesting. We are now sourcing bark for the floor, manure and topsil for the ebds and then we wil be ready to go!
